Quarterly Fund Update: Salt NZ Dividend Appreciation Fund – 30 September 2018

This fund update was first made publicly available on 5 November 2018

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Salt NZ Dividend Appreciation Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Salt Investment Funds Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Salt NZ Dividend Appreciation Fund targets a portfolio of shares of New Zealand companies that may, in our opinion, pay high and sustainable dividends. A considerable body of robust research suggests that stocks with strong and sustained dividend policies tend to generate higher free cash flow than average and outperform their index benchmarks over time. The strategy is not intended to naively generate the highest possible yield but rather to generate a high and sustainable dividend yield.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Salt NZ Dividend Appreciation Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.


How has the fund performed?


Example of how this applies to an investor

Sam had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Sam received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,561 (that is 15.61% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Sam a total return after tax of \$1,444 for the year.
